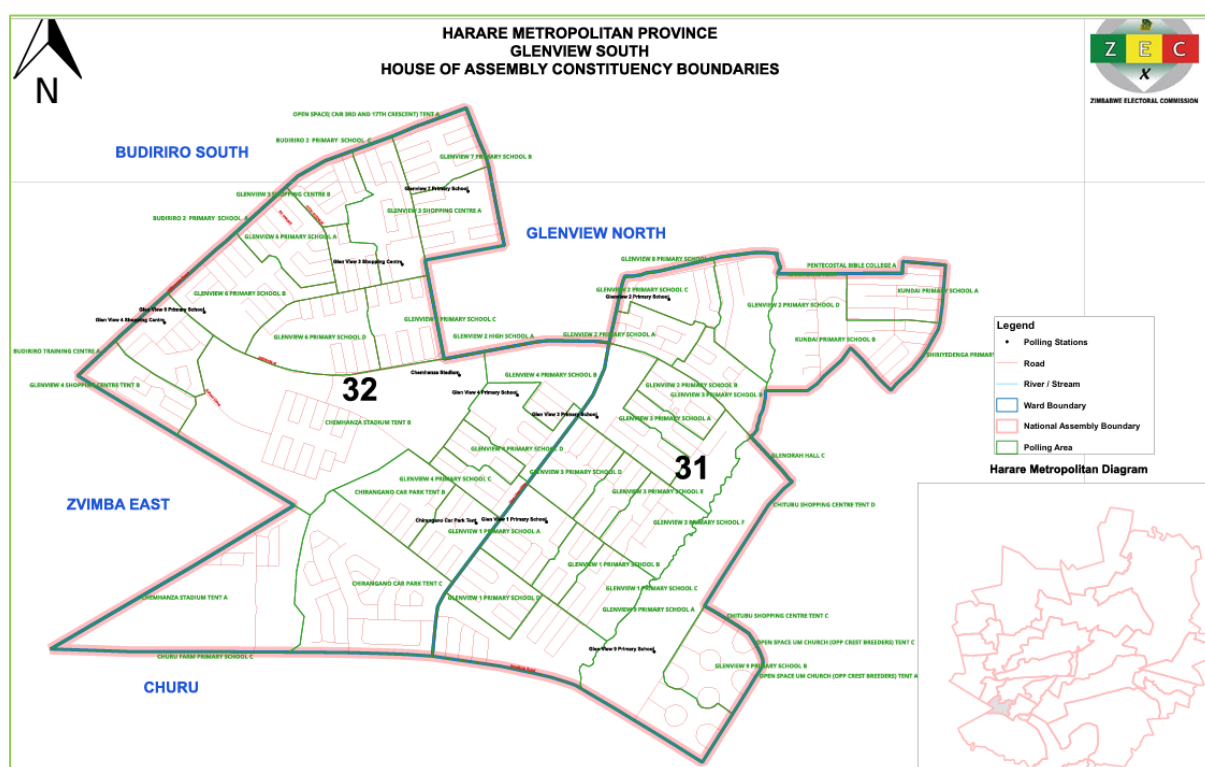

GLENVIEW SOUTH BY ELECTION CONSTITUENCY PROFILE APRIL 2025

Introduction

Glenview South Constituency is located in Harare, Zimbabwe's capital. This urban constituency shares borders with Budiriro South, Glenview North, Zvimba East and Churu. A by-election is scheduled for 12 April 2025 following the convening of the Nomination Court on 13 March 2025. This by-election was necessitated by the passing on of Honourable Gladmore Hakata, the sitting Member of Parliament (MP) for Glenview South, who had been elected as a representative of the Citizens Coalition for Change (CCC) party during the 2023 Harmonised Elections. Through Statutory Instrument (S.I.) 16 of 2025 (Proclamation 1 of 2025) gazetted on 24 February 2025, the President set 13 March 2025 as the date for the Nomination Court sitting and 12 April 2025 as the by-election day.

Nomination Court

The Nomination Court sat on 13 March 2025 to receive nomination papers from prospective candidates. The ZANU-PF candidate pre-submitted her nomination papers on 11 March 2025. In total, five (5) candidates were duly nominated to contest the 12 April National Assembly by-election for the Constituency. Among them, two are affiliated to political parties: Perpetua Mukanda of the National Constitutional Assembly (NCA) and Tsitsi Tranquillity Tahomaera of ZANU-PF. The remaining three candidates – Tonderai Chakaredza, Tungamirai Madzokere, and George Makwangaidze – filed as independents.

Previous Election Results

Glenview South consists of two (2) Wards (31 and 32) of Harare Municipality. According to the 2022 Report on the Delimitation Report, the Constituency has a total of 29,696 registered voters. In 2023, it had 43 polling stations spread across wards 31 and 32.¹ The opposition candidate representing CCC won the majority vote in a contest with two other candidates representing UZA and ZANU-PF.

Pre-electoral Environment

ZESN has been tracking electoral and political developments in Glenview South ahead of the by-election, scheduled for 12 March 2025. While the political environment has been relatively peaceful, ZESN has received reports of heightened tensions, such as those witnessed between youths from the NCA party and the ZANU-PF who traded allegations of defacing each other's posters.

Another incident which marred the peaceful campaign period relates to the South's Ward 32 Councillor's property, including cars and part of the councillor's house, which were damaged. The motive of the attack is yet to be established; however, the affected councillor is reported to be suspecting opponents from a faction of her political party to be responsible since there is already tension occasioned by the fielding of three candidates from the opposition who are running as independent candidates but are campaigning under the banner of the former CCC president.

Generally, all electoral contestants (Chakaredza Tonderai, Madzokere Tungamirai, Makwangwadze George, Mukanda Perpetua and Tahomera Tsitsi Tranquility) appear to have been granted an opportunity to canvass for votes. ZANU-PF had the most visible campaigns. The party's rallies were addressed by high-ranking officials within the party, including the Chairperson for Mashonaland East province, the Chairperson for Harare province, Secretary for Youth Affairs, Provincial Political Commissar, Harare Provincial Youth Chairperson and a representative of the Chairperson of the Youth League.

Door-to-door campaigns were reportedly utilised by the ZANU-PF party, NCA party, and one of the three independent candidates (George Makwangwaidze). Tonderai Chakaredza, one of the independent candidates, reportedly distributed fliers. All electoral candidates reportedly produced posters for their campaigns.

Socio-economic status

Glenview South predominantly comprises middle-class residents. Harare has faced significant economic challenges, including high unemployment levels, limited access to clean and safe water, shortages of health-care systems and services, and road infrastructure that is in dire need of repair. Additionally, the Constituency struggles to contain drug abuse, and the suburb is highly informalised as is the case in most parts of Harare. Glenview South has however, benefitted from the solar-powered borehole and electricity schemes that are meant to alleviate water shortages and improve residents' quality of life².

Conclusion

ZESN urges the electoral contestant to continue encouraging their supporters to campaign in peace and to uphold the code of conduct for campaigns as enshrined in the Electoral Act. Voters in Glenview South are also encouraged to turn out in large numbers and exercise their Constitutional right to vote in a peaceful and orderly manner.
